Children's Fitness Tax Credit

All children age 16 and under are eligible for up to \$500 Fitness Tax Credit Claim for participation in (qualifying) recreation programs that promote health and fitness. Children with disabilities (who receive the Disability Tax Credit) age 18 and under are eligible for an additional credit claim of \$500, for a total of up to \$1000 Fitness Tax Credit Claim each year

Special Services At Home (SSAH)

This program helps families who are caring for a child with a developmental or physical disability. The family can use the funding to hire a worker to help the child learn new skills, or to pay for respite programs **New applications are placed on a waitlist – it would be to your advantage to apply as soon as possible
